In your proposal, please include the title of your paper, institutional affiliation, mailing address, and email address. Submissions will be evaluated by the Group's board members. Successful applicants will be notified within two weeks, and the final program will be sent by the end of February. The Group's annual business meeting will take place on the day of the conference as well.
